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Building Permit Software Survey Report

Executive Summary

Maryland Department of Planning's (Planning) 2020 survey of county and municipal building permit software systems shows that most counties and larger municipalities are using third-party building permit software, with only two large counties using a software system developed in-house. The smaller jurisdictions that track building permit activity tend to use off the shelf office software, specifically Microsoft Office. More than 40% of Maryland's counties also provided building permit and inspection services for their municipalities.

There is a relatively limited number of software vendors supporting building permit tracking for Maryland jurisdictions. The top six software firms used by jurisdictions process 75% of all new housing permits on an annual basis in Maryland. While most counties and a majority of municipalities responding to the survey indicate they report local building activity, less than half of the counties and 20% of the municipalities post building reports online. Based on the survey responses, there appear to be opportunities for increased coordination and sharing of local building permit data with Planning and the potential to develop a statewide building permit reporting system that could help better describe the economic conditions of our communities, which would improve the accuracy of state projections of future development using near real time monitoring of construction activity.

Purpose

Title 12, [§12-505](#), of the Public Safety Article requires that each local jurisdiction shall enforce the current version of the Maryland Building Performance Standards. At a minimum, the local jurisdiction shall implement these standards by reviewing plans, issuing building permits, inspecting the work, and issuing use/occupancy certificates. How local jurisdictions fulfill this responsibility varies among counties and municipalities across the state. To better understand the approaches taken by counties and municipalities that administer the building permit and inspection process, and to identify what software tools jurisdictions use, Planning conducted a survey in fall 2020 of all jurisdictions in Maryland. This report documents the responses received, analyzes commonalities, and serves as a resource for improved communication among jurisdictions with similar building permit software or for those considering changing software vendors.

Methodology

Planning prepared a short online survey (see Appendix A) using Google Forms to solicit information on how local governments manage the processing of building permits. The survey includes 14 questions to ascertain if the jurisdiction issues building permits; if they use some type of software to track permits; who can be contacted for more information about their permit system; and if they report their permit information publicly.

Using Planning's local government contact databases, supplemented by information on local governments' official websites, an email invitation to participate in the online survey was sent in fall 2020 to 177 of the 180 local jurisdictions in Maryland. (*Three small towns do not have a published public email address.*) A total of 312 people associated with the counties and municipalities were solicited to complete the survey.

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The emails sent to planning departments, building officials, and town managers explained the purpose of the survey, informed them the survey should take about two to three minutes to complete, and included the link to the Google Form Survey. The standard email survey request stated -

Planning is trying to get a better handle on local governments' building permit software systems and learn how you track building activity. We realize that many counties also handle the building permitting for some municipalities, but we are asking both counties and municipalities about their building permit software systems to get a statewide picture of who tracks building permits in your community. The short survey (which should take about two minutes or less to complete) will help us identify who is the most knowledgeable person in your community regarding your building permit system and the type of software you use to track permits. Ultimately, we will produce a report on the building permit software used throughout the state that you can reference when you are considering upgrading your building permit software system or have a question that another jurisdiction with the same type of building permit software may be able to answer. This information will also be used to initiate conversations about potentially sharing building permit information in a statewide reporting system modeled somewhat after the reporting system that the Baltimore Metropolitan Council maintains.

Results

According to the *CustomerThermometer.com* website, "A survey response rate of 50% or higher should be considered excellent in most circumstances. A high response rate is likely driven by high levels of motivation to complete the survey, or a strong personal relationship between business and customer." Planning has built strong relationships with our local government partners as reflected in 52% of the 180 Maryland jurisdictions completing the survey (94 responses). We appreciate the valuable insights these jurisdictions have offered regarding their building permit process and the software they use.

The individual responses to the survey can be found in Appendix B. Based on Planning's review of the responses, there is great diversity in Maryland on how building permits are processed. Except for those municipalities that delegate all building permit processing to the county, each jurisdiction has their own way of processing building permits – as unique as each jurisdiction's zoning regulations. However, the responses show some common approaches and preferred building permit software applications. The survey response analysis can be categorized under the following topics:

- Who participated in the survey?
- How do jurisdictions manage their building permits?
- What type of building permit software are jurisdictions using?
- Do jurisdictions publicly report their building activity?

Who participated in the survey?

A total of 94 jurisdictions completed the online survey. This includes all 24 counties (including Baltimore City) and 70 municipalities. At least one town or city completed the survey in every county with municipalities.

A regional distribution of the jurisdictions participating in the online survey can be found in Table 1. While the Capital Region has the highest number of municipalities participating, many of those towns do not have planning and zoning authority and coordinate their building permit review with Montgomery

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or Prince George’s County under the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. The regional distribution of municipalities that participated in the survey generally reflects the concentration of municipalities in Maryland.

With all counties and 70 municipalities participating, the survey results reflect the permitting operations from the most populous county, to a town of less than 150 people (2019 est.). Not only did 45% of Maryland’s municipalities participate in the survey, but 14 of the top 15 and 21 of the top 25 most populous towns completed the survey. Based on the US Census Building Permits Survey of annual reported building permits by Maryland jurisdictions, the jurisdictions that participated in the online survey accounted for 99.82% of all new housing units permitted over the past six years. This provides a high degree of confidence that the survey responses will be highly reflective of building permit practices at the local level. (See Appendix C for listing of 2014-2019 six-year annual average of building permits and Appendix D for population ranking of Maryland counties and municipalities.)

How do jurisdictions manage their building permits?

All counties in Maryland issue building permits and use some type of building permit software, but only 10 counties (41%) provide some form of permit processing for municipalities in their county (Calvert, Carroll, Cecil, Dorchester, Frederick, Garrett, Montgomery, Prince George's, Washington, and Wicomico counties). A total of 41 of the 70 municipalities (59%) responding to the survey indicated they use their county’s building permit system. For many of the municipalities in these counties, some form of memorandum of understanding (formally or informally) appears to exist on how to process building permits and the associated building inspections between the county and the municipality. Some respondents indicated a separate zoning certificate is required from the municipality before the county building permit can be issued, and in some cases separate municipal software is used to track these certificates or similar local requirements. Some of the larger municipalities within these counties process their own building permits using their own software.

With Baltimore City and Baltimore and Howard counties not having any municipalities, the municipalities in the remaining eleven counties independently issue building permits without going through a county permit system. (Allegany, Anne Arundel, Caroline, Charles, Harford, Kent, Queen Anne's, St. Mary's, Somerset, Talbot, and Worcester counties do not issue building permits for their municipalities.) A total of 20 municipalities in these eleven counties participated in the survey, and 17 of those 20 municipalities use some form of building permit software. The others indicated they process building permits by hand.

Of the 70 municipalities that responded to the survey, 37 municipalities (53%) indicated they used some form of software to track building activity, while 33 municipalities (47%) indicated that no software was

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used – presumably either the municipality delegates its permitting duties to the county, or the municipality uses some form of hand processing of building permits. Because some municipalities use the county’s permitting system, a direct relationship between the size of a municipality and the use of building permit software cannot be determined from this survey. Seven municipalities (10%) report not using any building permit software and do not appear to use the county’s building permit system. Presumably, these municipalities issue and track building permits using handwritten logs.

What type of building permit software are jurisdictions using?

Half of the 94 jurisdictions (47) responding to the survey indicated they purchased their building permit software from a private vendor; 20 jurisdictions (21%) have building permit software systems that were developed in-house; and 27 jurisdictions (29%) either do not have, or do not know what type of building permit software/system they are using. Of the 20 jurisdictions that indicated the building permit software was developed in-house, nine jurisdictions report using Microsoft software applications (three MS Access and six MS Excel) to track building permits. It should be noted that some of the jurisdictions, who did not know what building permit software they used, are using their county’s software system. Baltimore County developed an in-house building permit system, using an IBM Host on Demand Mainframe, but will be migrating to Azteca Cityworks PLL (<https://www.cityworks.com/products/cityworks-pll/>) after September 2021. For purposes of analyzing building permit software, Baltimore County’s new building permit system is included with all other third-party software vendors (47 originally responded have 3rd party software plus Baltimore County for a total of 48).

The 48 jurisdictions responding that they purchased private sector software to manage their building permit activity identified 16 different software applications/firms. Table 2 is a summary breakdown of the building permit software that jurisdictions use. A detailed listing of software each jurisdiction uses can be found in Appendix B.

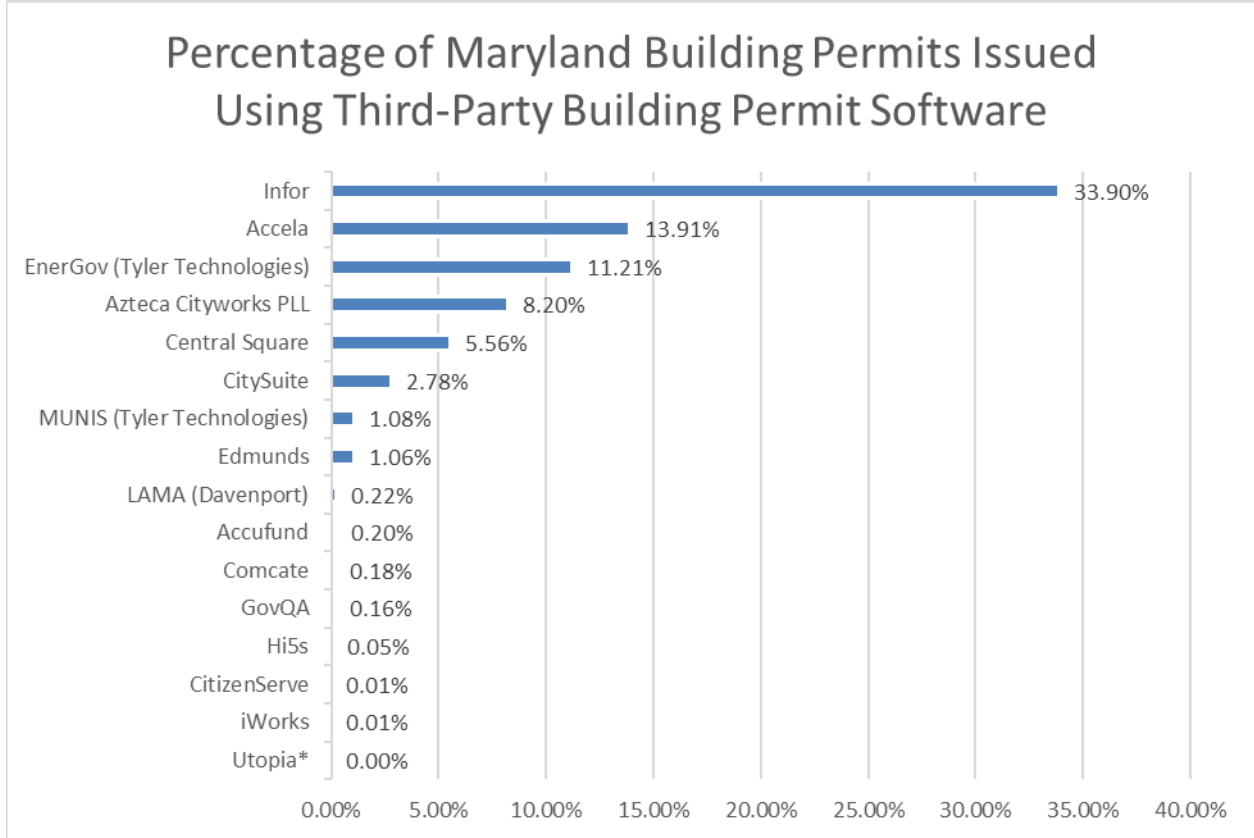

According to the survey respondents, the 16 building permit software companies processed 79% of the new housing building permit activity in Maryland over the past six years, as listed in Figure 1. Infor’s series of building software applications (Version 11, Infor Public Sector, Hansen) processed one-third of the new housing building permits in Maryland, followed by Accela government software at 14%, Tyler Technologies EnerGov civic services software at 11%, Azteca Cityworks PLL at 8%, and Central Square at 6%.

* Greenbelt uses Utopia to track building permits, but permits are issued by Prince George’s County using Infor software.

At the county level, there are seven building permit software vendors that processed nearly 70% of the new housing building permits in Maryland for the 19 counties listed below. (see Table 3)

At the municipal level, there are 15 building permit software vendors that processed 9% of the new housing building permits in Maryland for the 29 municipalities listed below (see Table 4). It should be noted that some jurisdictions do not report on new building permits, as this is done by the county.

There are twenty jurisdictions that use internally developed building permit tracking software or who did not indicate the type of software used in the survey (See Table 5). This includes five counties. Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County have internally developed building permit software systems, while Allegany and Garrett use Microsoft Office developed permit systems. Worcester County reported its permit system was internally developed but does not use Microsoft software.

Do jurisdictions publicly report their building activity?

All but four of the counties (20 or 83% of the counties) responded that they prepare a report on the county’s building activities, and 35 (50%) of the municipalities responding to the survey indicated they publish reports on their building activity. Eleven counties (46%) and 13 municipalities (19%) -a total of 24 jurisdictions-responded that they post a report on the jurisdiction’s building activity online.

To test the availability of local building permit reports online, a series of Google searches were done for those counties that indicated they reported and posted building permit (or development) activity. A Building Permit Activity Summary Report was easily found on the county’s website for eight of the 11 counties indicating that they posted building permit activity; however, the content of the reports varies widely but can be grouped into three general categories: (1) general reporting (monthly or annually) on the number of building permits by type of construction; (2) reporting of building permit activity impact on local adequate public facilities regulations; and (3) annual report on development activity trends and its impact on local growth management policies. The Baltimore Metropolitan Council (BMC) collectively tracks and reports on the building permit activity for the seven counties in their region (Baltimore City, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford, Howard, and Queen Anne’s counties), which accounts for 43% of Maryland’s building activity. (It should be noted that Carroll County responded to the survey indicating they do not report building permit activity.) BMC reports on residential and nonresidential building activity for the region and for each

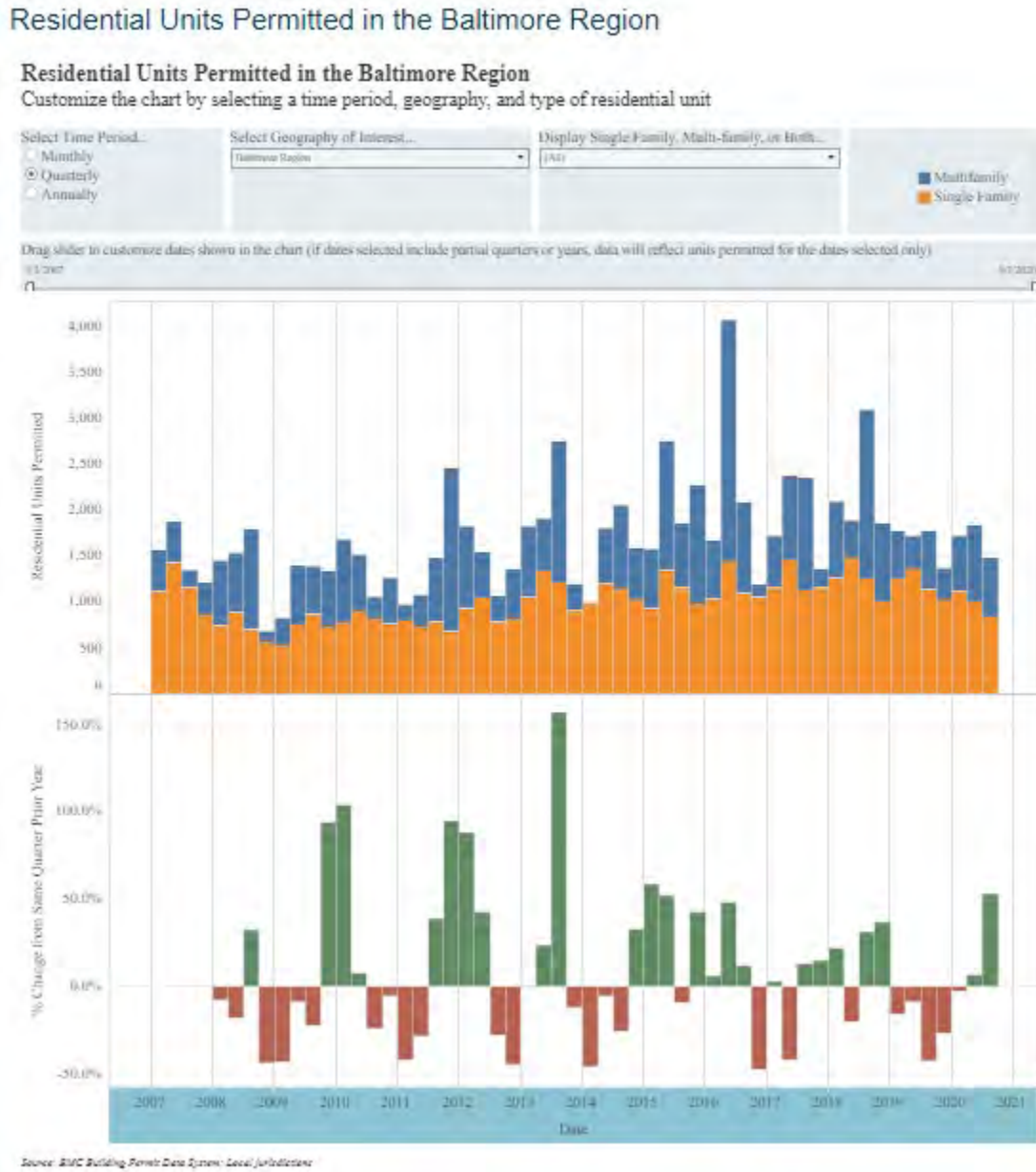
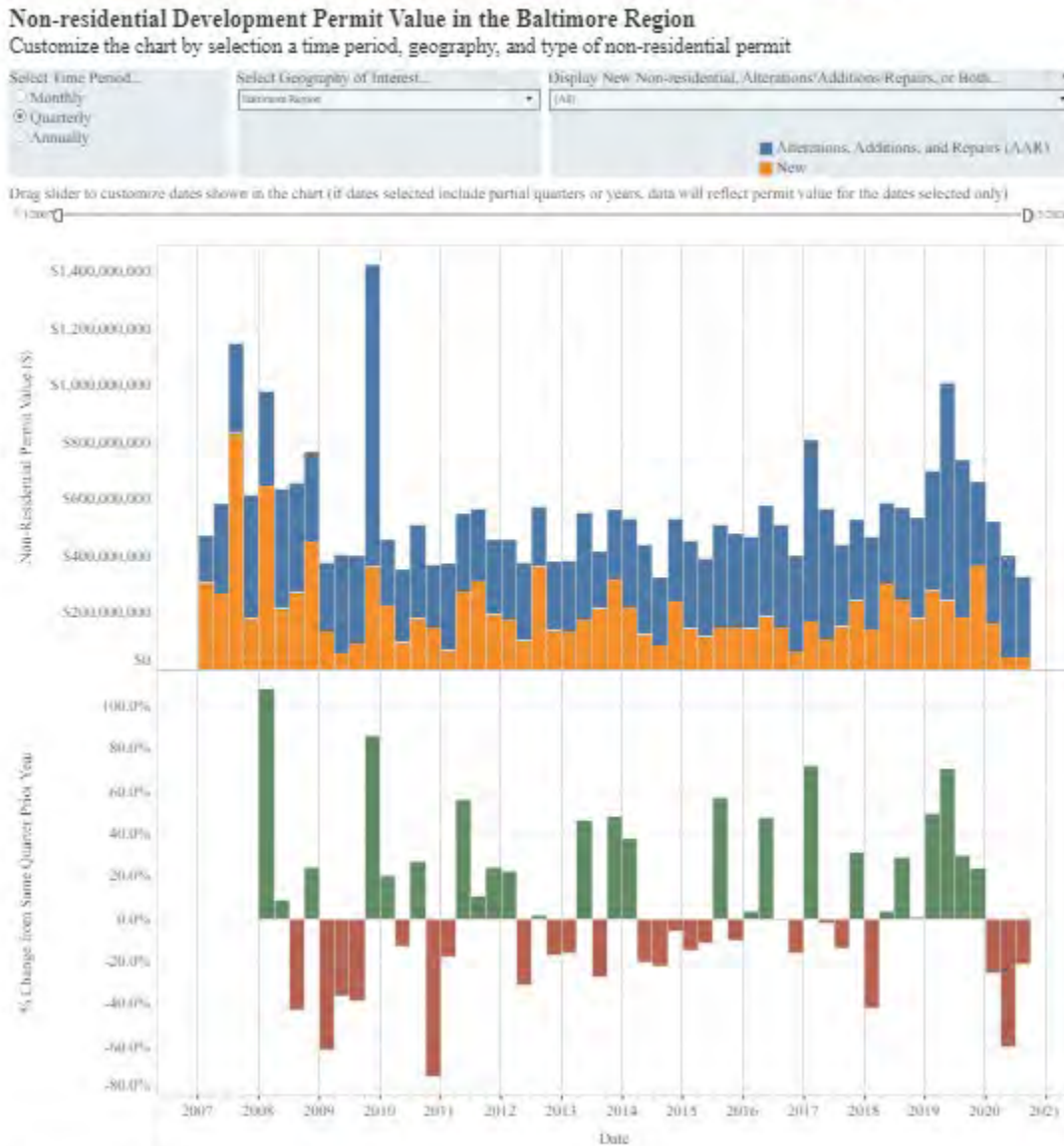


Figure 3: Baltimore Metropolitan Council Nonresidential Building Permit Dashboard

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county using separate dashboards for each. For residential development (See Figure 2), the dashboard shows the type of units permitted, and for nonresidential development (Figure 3), the dashboard displays the cumulative permit value of new development and of alterations, additions, and repairs. However, in the Washington Council of Government (WashCOG) region, which accounts for 36% of Maryland’s building activity, there is no consolidated reporting of building activity, and two of the four counties (Frederick and Montgomery) indicated they report and post online building activity. BMC is unique in the state for its development permit reporting. No other metropolitan planning council or tri-county council in Maryland provides this type of coordination and reporting on building permits.

Figure 2: Baltimore Metropolitan Council Residential Building Permit Dashboard

Conclusions and Recommendations

Given the local participation rate in Planning’s building permit software survey, with 24 Maryland counties and 70 municipalities responding (accounting for 99.82% of all new housing permits processed), the following conclusions reflect the building permit operations in Maryland’s jurisdictions:

- All counties use some form of building permit tracking, and 41% of the counties also provide building permit processing for all or some of the municipalities within the county.
- Most of Maryland’s municipalities have some form of computerized permit tracking (either a dedicated specialty software or internally developed home-grown tracking using Microsoft Office Suite). It appears that smaller jurisdictions tend to use internally developed building permit tracking using Microsoft Office software or handwritten reporting.

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- There is a limited number of building permit software firms (16) serving Maryland's jurisdictions, and this number may continue to decline due to consolidation in the building permit software industry. (Several jurisdictions noted their current building software firm had recently merged with another firm.)
- Except for Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County, which have internally developed permit systems, 75% of all new housing permits are processed using the top six software firms (Infor, Accela, EnerGov (Tyler Technologies), Azteca Cityworks PLL, Central Square, and CitySuite).
- Less than half of the counties and less than 20% of the municipalities post their local building permit activity online.

Based on the survey responses, Planning may want to consider the following initiatives:

- Work with BMC to better understand the coordination and building permit processing required to consolidate permit data from different local building permit systems into a regional reporting format.
- Share best practice examples of building permit reporting and facilitate the development of standard data collection and reporting practices that can be used to generate reports for state and local governments, as well as the private sector and the public to monitor growth and economic development in their community.
- Explore opportunities for coordinating and sharing local building permit data with the state agencies and among regional planning organizations, modeled after BMCs' development reporting system, to gain a better understanding of local development activity and to improve the accuracy of state projections of future development using near real time monitoring of construction activity. Through improved coordination and interpretation of local building permit data, a potential statewide building reporting system could be developed modeled after BMC's development reporting system.
- Routinely engage jurisdictions with similar software systems to identify items of shared concern or opportunities to educate and improve the effectiveness of using the building permit software.
- Maintain a contact database of building permit software experts at the local level to support the communication and coordination among jurisdictions with the same type of building permit software or to serve as a reference if a jurisdiction is considering selecting a new software firm.
